- Economy -- static or shrinking library budgets; mergers & dissolutions of member organizations
- Technology-- online resources, contract negotiations, serving technologically sophisticated users
- Activism -- membership participation in association events and involvement in governing NJLLA through committee roles and Executive Board offices

This strategic plan has been formulated to guide the association as it moves forward facing future challenges. Strategic planning provides a way for the association to choose its destination, chart the route it will take and determine the resources that it will need along the way. This plan should serve as a framework for decisions and a building block for the future.

The NJLLA Manual of Policy and Procedure (Manual), which is found on NJLLA's website, contains details for carrying out the goals included in this plan. The Manual should be consulted for specifics about duties and procedures. At the beginning of each new Association year, the Executive Board should review the plan to ensure goals remain current and responsive to

members' needs and to select specific goals to focus on for that year. The Manual is revised regularly and represents the living document governing the operation of NJLLA.

Goal II: To provide opportunities for educational and professional development for the membership.

Goal III: To enhance the recognition and value of NJLLA members as the foremost leaders and experts in legal information, research and technology.

Goal V - To adapt new technology into the delivery of resources, education and information to members and others through the NJLLA website and additional information outlets.
